Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time! It's that time of year when we are directed to be aware of the end-times and how this awareness should really undergird our lives. In the very short first reading from the Book of Malachi, the prophet foretells of the destruction that will occur for those who are evil while the righteous will be spared. "But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays." Then in the second reading from 2 Thessalonians, Paul presents himself as a model for other to follow. The people of faith should seek order and work quietly for the benefit of all. If they remain true to their faith in Jesus and follow Paul's example all will be well. "Rather we wanted to present ourselves as a model for you, so that you might imitate us." Then in Luke's gospel we have a very bleak description of all the destruction that will be fall the world but there will be a hopeful outcome in the end for those who are true to the name of Jesus. "You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

The scripture readings that herald the end of the liturgical year are filled with drama. Are you ready for the end-times? Grab your ticket and let's go! Stay awake, repent, and prepare. Pay attention on how you are living and be sure to make amends where needed, for the coming of the Day of Judgment of the Lord is swift. All these premonitions are the Church's way of calling us to be ready. A good way to start is by paying attention more to our physical world, the way we live and how we bring God's love to others. That's the best way to prepare for the celebration of God's incarnation to human life at Christmas. There are many questions to ask oneself. Do my values reflect those of the Gospel and Jesus' life? Are my actions directed in service to others? Am I faithful to my beliefs? Am I nourished by the Church Community?

Living well will not rescue us from life's trials and persecutions. It will, however, help us on our journey to become compassionate and understanding people. While science tells u the world could go on for millions more years, it is also possible that we could snuff out human life in time through nuclear war or other means. God gave us free will, but it is up to us how we use it to bring about health and well-being for the world.

What we hear in today's gospel would be an encouragement to watch and be ready. As people of faith, we must always live in a constant state of waiting for Jesus to come again in glory. We just don't know the day or the hour, but we do know that our world very much needs the love of Jesus along with God's mercy and grace.

In this bulletin you will find a financial report from the fiscal year September 2021-August 2022. As you can see, we were able to finish the year on the plus side. While this is good there are challenges this year and in the future that will prove difficult to stay on the plus side. One factor is there is no more income left from the school and beginning with the next fiscal year we will be responsible for paying some percentage to the diocesan school fund since we no longer have a school or are part of a regional school. Hopefully we will have some solid rental use of our school building in place by then to help offset these changes. In the meantime, we need to maintain a healthy contribution level from all parishioners as well as successful fundraising. As always, I thank you for the financial help you give to St. Raymond Parish.

Our *Countdown to Christmas Raffle* is underway and people are getting their chances in to be included in the daily drawings that will start on Thanksgiving Day and conclude on Christmas. Over \$5000 will be awarded during those days so get your chances in. They were mailed in the regular envelope mailing, as well as in a parish-wide mailing that recently went out and an order form is also included in the bulletin.

Remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Besides the aforementioned there is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, an order from for the special One Year Memorial Candles that begin new again on the First Sunday of Advent, an order form for the Christmas Plants Sale, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. 
SECOND READING 2 Thes 3:7-12



St. Raymond Memorials

Often people ask if there is something they could memorialize in memory of a loved one. Besides having *Mass Intentions*, there are other opportunities for individuals, families and groups to remember a loved one in a tangible and sometimes lasting way. Some of the weekly liturgical memorials that we have are the *Bread and Wine*, the *Rose for Life* and the *Sanctuary Lamp*. These memorials can be arranged at the rectory.



There are also other liturgical items that are seasonal, like the *Christmas* and *Easter Flowers*, the *Paschal Candle*,

Advent Wreath Candles and other holy items we can use for religious services. Then we also have a certain lasting type of memorial called a "Memorial Brick" that can be set in one of four beautiful outside locations. One location is by the Holy Family Statue on the front lawn of the rectory, the St. Teresa Statue behind the rectory, the God and Country Memorial near the front of the church and finally our newest Padre Pio Statue on the walkway between the rectory and church. Each location is open for anyone wishing to have such a Memorial Brick placed there.

These bricks are 4" by 8" with up to three lines of text. The donation for each brick is \$250. Anyone wishing to purchase one of these bricks should contact the rectory during regular office hours. Maybe you will consider one of these special places on the grounds of St. Raymond to celebrate life and pay tribute to someone dear to you.
