Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The readings this Sunday show us that just like Jesus we need to grow in our sense of mission, of being a baptized Christian. In the first reading from Isaiah, we have the dominant theme of justice promoted which pervades all of Isaiah. Doing what is just and right is precisely the spiritual quality that is supposed to distinguish God's servants in the world. "Observe what is right, do what is just; for my salvation is about to come, my justice, about to be revealed." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul is hoping that the people of Israel will accept the Gospel once they see Gentiles doing so. "I glory in my ministry in order to make my race jealous and thus save some of them." And finally, in Matthew's gospel, we have Jesus meeting the Canaanite woman and her request for the healing of her daughter. We see in this exchange the issue of Jesus' mission extending beyond the house of Israel. It will be the Christian mission to reach out to the Gentiles. As always, it comes down to the power and importance of one's faith, not who they are or where they come from. "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish."

No one can do everything! There is no need to feel guilty about hanging up on a robocall or discarding the fifth charitable appeal to arrive in the weekly mail. But as we try to make our lives more manageable, do we realize that we may be suffocating in a world that we have made smaller and more convenient. And we may have a sense of fatigue when we compare our limited time and energy with the enormous needs around us within our families, parish, community and beyond. Was Jesus tired when he made his initial response to the Canaanite woman? Was she draining precious time and energy from his mission to announce the kingdom to the Jewish people? There were many instances when those around Jesus did not consider certain people worthy of Jesus' attention. Besides the woman in today's gospel, there was the Samaritan woman at the well. Zacchaeus the tax collector, the Roman centurion, and many others. And lots of times it is hard to comprehend what Jesus is doing or saying. How many of us feel the older son in the Prodigal Son story got a raw deal, or those who worked in the vineyards for a short time should have gotten paid as much as those who worked all day? If we had the chance, we might happily rewrite parts of the Gospels to correct several of Jesus' sayings and actions.

What Jesus does here and elsewhere is respond on the basis of a person's faith. The woman did not have the luxury of accepting Jesus' initial response of refusing to cure her daughter. She understood that it was not about her, rather about her daughter. She becomes one of the most faith-filled people whom Jesus meets in the Gospel. Jesus encouraged her. Do we do the same for the faith-filled people whom we meet? Jesus gave us the Eucharist not to keep our worlds neat and tidy but rather to open us up to God's grace, which always calls us to people and places we might otherwise have avoided.

Our new round of *Parish Picks* starts this week and will run for the next six months. There is still time to get in on the action. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Let's keep praying for all those suffering from COVID-19, that they soon regain good health. Let's also pray for those who have died and their families. And we always remember all the medical and emergency personnel who continue to meet the challenges of this health crisis. May those in research find safe treatments and vaccines that will help defeat this virus.

There are also other liturgical items that are seasonal, like the *Christmas* and *Easter Flowers*, the *Paschal Candle*, *Advent Wreath Candles* and other holy items we can use for religious services. Then we also have a certain lasting type of memorial called a "Memorial Brick" that can be set in one of four beautiful outside locations. One location is by the *Holy Family Statue* on the front lawn of the rectory, the *St. Teresa Statue* behind the rectory, the *God and Country Memorial* near the front of the church and finally our newest *Padre Pio Statue* on the walkway between the rectory and church. Each location is open for anyone wishing to have such a Memorial Brick placed there.

These bricks are 4" by 8" with up to three lines of text. The donation for each brick is \$250. Anyone wishing to purchase one of these bricks should contact the rectory during regular office hours. Maybe you will consider one of these special places on the grounds of St. Raymond to celebrate life and pay tribute to someone dear to you.
