Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Easter blessings be yours on the Fourth Sunday of Easter! Today we celebrate "Good Shepherd Sunday," when we affirm Jesus as our Good Shepherd who is dedicated to his flock and lays down his very life for our protection and well-being. In the first reading from Acts, we have Peter making sure that the people understand that any healings they witness, like the crippled man's healing, is done solely through the name of Jesus Christ. And it is faith in Jesus that becomes our surest foundation cornerstone. "He is the stone rejected by you the builders, which has become the cornerstone." Peter is saying all this to those who were bent on arresting him and John and having them thrown into prison. Then in the second reading from 1 John, we are called children of God. This distinction goes counter to what the world sees and judges. "Beloved: See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are." And finally, John's gospel gives us the image of the "Good Shepherd." Jesus personifies this image, and it illustrates how he is the leader, is good, knows his sheep and they know him, and even extends his leadership to those outside of this flock. The ways Jesus leads are by service: "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep."


All of us belong to different flocks and we have different shepherds who are the leaders of these flocks. Sometimes we are the shepherds. The important quality of a shepherd is to be trustworthy, someone you can count on. Whether you promise to read a bedtime story to your child or visit an elderly friend-do it! Whether you promise to pick up the bats and balls after practice or put out the trash-do it! Be trustworthy. Always see that you can be counted on and your flock will be encouraged. A good shepherd also does not leave the scene when wolves threaten or attack the flock. He or she stays seeing to the safety and needs of the flock. Although we may be tempted to run away from or distance ourselves from family members or friends who go through public scandal or are the source of gossip and teasing; a good shepherd stands by his or her flock, no matter what. In today's gospel, Jesus says that he will lay down his life for his sheep. He will give everything he has to guarantee their safety and salvation. The best shepherds are always willing to sacrifice for the good of others.

Although we can easily get lost in the fields of temptation, anxiety and despair, good shepherds stay the course. He or she does this by listening to the voice of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and by following what the Good News tells us to do. Love, show mercy, forgive, care for the least, feed the hungry, shelter the homeless and pray always. Be *salt. Be light.* These are the ways to be good shepherds. Plus, all we do as good shepherds is meant to lead others to the kingdom of God, step by step, example by example and day by day. And always remember that we do not accomplish any of this on our own. Jesus the real Good Shepherd provides all we need to care for the sheep of his flock. May the gift of the Eucharist meet all our physical and spiritual needs of healing and strength.

This weekend we celebrated the first of our *First Holy Communion Masses*. I always say that this is the most important day in the life of a Catholic, when one can fully share in the gift of the Body of Jesus at Mass. From this day forward, we are as close to Jesus as we can get. And we receive the spiritual strength we need to live our lives in faith, hope and love. May our children who received for the first time today be filled with the love of and the love for Jesus all the days of their lives.

Remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and an ad for adult Catholics to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday, the Litany of St. Joseph and other prayers for different occasions, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great Fourth Week of Easter. *Keep* spreading Easter joy as you smile and share with those in need. Plus remember: Sorrow looks back, worry looks around, faith looks up. God bless always. -Father Chuck




St. Raymond Human Life Committee

After a speech, pro-life activist, Penny Lea, was approached by an old man. Weeping, he told her: "I lived in Germany during the Nazi Holocaust. I attended church since I was a small boy. We heard the stories of what was happening to the Jews, but like most people today in this country, we tried to distance ourselves from the reality of what was really taking place. What could anyone do to stop it. A railroad track ran behind our small church, and each Sunday morning we would hear whistle from the distance...We became disturbed when one Sunday we noticed cries coming from the train as it passed by. We grimly realized that the train was carrying Jews. They were like cattle in those cars! Week after week that train whistle would blow. We would dread to hear the sound of those old wheels because we knew that the Jews would be crying out to us as they passed our church. It was so terribly disturbing! We could do nothing to help those poor miserable people, yet their screams tormented us. We knew exactly what time that whistle would blow, and we decided the only way to keep from being disturbed by the cries was to start singing our hymns.. at the top of our voices. If some of the screams reached our ears, we'd just sing a little louder until we could hear them no more. Years have passed and no one talks about it much anymore, but I can still hear that whistle and hear them crying out for help in my sleep. God forgive all of us who called ourselves Christians, yet did nothing to intervene. Now, so many years later, I see it happening all over again in America. God forgive you Americans for you having blocked out the screams of millions of your own children. The holocaust is here. The response is the same as was in my country -

SILENCE!" (Heritage House '76, Inc.)







St. Raymond Memorials

Often people ask if there is something they could memorialize in memory of a loved one. Besides having **Mass Intentions**, there are other opportunities for individuals, families and groups to remember a loved one in a tangible and sometimes lasting way. Some of the weekly liturgical memorials that we have are the **Bread and Wine**, the **Rose for Life** and the **Sanctuary Lamp**. These memorials can be arranged at the rectory.



Flowers, the *Paschal Candle*, *Advent Wreath Candles* and other holy items we can use for religious services. Then we also have a certain lasting type of memorial called a *"Memorial Brick"* that can be set in one of four beautiful outside locations. One location is by the *Holy Family Statue* on the front lawn of the rectory, the *St. Teresa Statue* behind the rectory, the *God and Country Memorial* near the front of the church and finally our newest *Padre Pio Statue* on the walkway between the rectory and church. Each location is open for anyone wishing to have such a Memorial Brick placed there.

These bricks are 4" by 8" with up to three lines of text. The donation for each brick is \$250. Anyone wishing to purchase one of these bricks should contact the rectory during regular office hours. Maybe you will consider one of these special places on the grounds of St. Raymond to celebrate life and pay tribute to someone dear to you.




