

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time! To celebrate the unknown "pushy" and pagan woman who dares to challenge Jesus in today's gospel is also a challenge to dispel any remaining sexism within ourselves. In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet challenges the people to do what is right and just. All nations will learn the ways of the Lord and faithful people from every nation will be welcome in God's house. "Observe what is right, do what is just; for my salvation is about to come, my justice, about to be revealed." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul is hopeful that both Gentile and Jew will come to accept the good news of Jesus Christ. He wants all people to be reconciled through Jesus. "For God delivered all to disobedience, that he might have mercy upon all." And finally, Matthew's gospel gives us a rather troubling narrative about a Gentile woman who comes to implore help from Jesus for her daughter and seems to get a rather non-caring response. Including this story in the scriptures is probably based on a real historical encounter that Jesus had. Now this woman uses expressions of Jewish faith like: "Lord, Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus would ordinarily respond to such a request with care and compassion. However, here he says nothing at first. Finally, he seems to dismiss the woman and her daughter because they are not Jews. Jesus probably saw his mission at first to be primarily for the Israelites, but as time went on he moved to an expansive understanding of his mission. This woman does not give up and even uses the term "dog" which was a reference to the Canaanites. "Even the dogs eat the scraps from the master's table." That does it. Her great faith wins the confrontation. Jesus intercedes and her daughter is healed. "O woman, great is your faith."

In today's gospel a woman breaks all the taboos in approaching Jesus. Just like the Taliban today, a woman in first century Palestine was not to speak in public to any man, not even a male family member. She had two strikes against her, being female and a Gentile. Now we may judge the ancient world more harshly, but it wasn't that long ago that woman in our 20th century society had second class status. Getting married meant quitting a job, woman rarely drove cars. Husbands were suspect if the wife worked outside the house. Even now slogans like "women's liberation" and "you've come a long way baby" were used in a society that seems to still be male dominated in career opportunities and pay scales.

The ancient world had many sexist customs. Aristotle said the female nature should be regarded as defective. Confucius said that 100 women were not worth a single man. The Greeks debated whether women are fully human. Female newborns were often discarded by Roman fathers and women were given to marriage without consent in Judaism. Even early Christianity placed women in subservient roles. The author of 1 Timothy wrote, "I do not permit women to teach or exercise authority." And even St. Augustine wrote: "I fail to see the use a woman has for a man." The woman in today's gospel, the woman who touched Jesus' cloak, the woman at the well, the woman who anointed Jesus at his burial: all these and countless others had an impact on the all-encompassing love of Jesus and have aided everyone of us in our growth in faith. Recall the women who have personally helped you form your own faith-probably starting with your mother. Give God thanks for all of them.

EXODUS 12:7,11,13

The story of the Passover is important for both Jews and Christians. In the Book of Exodus, we see the foreshadowing of Christ as the Paschal Lamb:

Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old...Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat them.

They shall eat the flesh that night...And you shall let none of it remain until morning...In this manner you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet. And your staff in your hand: and you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover (Ex 12:5,7,8,10,11).

During the time of their enslavement by the Egyptians, the Israelites were commanded by God to give a special sacrifice. This sacrifice freed them from the slavery that they had been in for over four hundred years. That sacrifice and meal did not take place that one time but is and has been commemorated every year by the Jewish people to remember their deliverance from slavery.

What is the connection with Jesus?

In the New Testament, Saint John the Baptist declares "Behold the Lamb of God. Who takes away the sin of the world!" (Jn. 1:29). Jesus is the fulfillment of the Jewish Passover that took place a thousand years before Him. We read in the Catechism:

By celebrating the Last Supper with his Apostles during the Passover meal, Jesus gave the Jewish Passover its definitive meaning. Jesus' passing over to his father by his death and Resurrection, the new Passover, is anticipated in the Supper and celebrated in the Eucharist, which fulfills the Jewish Passover and anticipates the final Passover of the Church in the glory of the kingdom.

Each week, we will present another of the twelve stations for your meditation for the week.

Week 2 Thought: Am I willing to follow the commands of God, like the Israelites did at the Passover?

The Hour That Makes My Day Excerpts from A Treasure in Clay, the Autobiography of Archbishop Sheen

On the day of my Ordination, I made two resolutions: First, I would offer the Holy Eucharist every Saturday in honor of the Blessed Mother to solicit her protection on my priesthood. Second, I resolved also to spend a continuous Holy Hour every day in the presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Briefly, here are some reasons why I have kept up this practice, and why I have encouraged it in others:

First, the Holy Hour is not a devotion; it is a sharing in the work of redemption. Our Lord asked: "Could you not watch one hour with Me?". Jesus asked for an hour of reparation to combat the hour of evil; an hour of union with the Cross to overcome the anti-love of sin.

Secondly, the only time Our Lord asked the Apostles for anything was the night he went into his agony. Not for an hour of activity did He plead, but for an hour of companionship.

The third reason I keep up the Holy Hour is to grow more and more into his likeness. We become like that which we gaze upon.

The purpose of the Holy Hour is to encourage a deep personal encounter with Christ. God is constantly inviting us to come to Him, to hold converse with Him, to ask for such things as we need and to experience what a blessing there is in fellowship with Him.

Saints Who Promoted Eucharistic Devotion

Saint Clare of Assisi Foundress († 1255) Feast: August 11

"Gaze upon him, consider him, contemplate him, as you desire to imitate him."

Chiara Offreduccio was born on July 16, 1194, to a wealthy noble family. Her mother named her Clare (Chiara) which means "light" in Italian. Even as a young girl, Clare was unusually devout and was deeply prayerful, and practiced a life of very real, but hidden, mortification.

After hearing St. Francis preach the Lenten service at San Giorgio Church in Assisi, Clare sought him out to learn how she might live the Gospel as he had preached it. Eventually, Clare was helped by Francis to establish a community of women who also desired to leave everything for Christ and live out the Gospel in a profound way. They were first called the Poor Ladies, but were later re-named the "Poor Clares," in honor of their foundress.

Most images of St. Clare depict her with a monstrance in her hands. This comes from an event that took place in 1244. Although she was very sick, St Clare prostrated herself before the ciborium containing the Eucharist, which she had placed in front of the convent door that Emperor Frederick II's troops were about to storm. Clare lived on that pure Bread which, according to the custom of the time, she could receive only seven times a year. Begging the Lord she said, "Lord, look upon these servants of yours, because I cannot protect them." A voice was heard coming from the Blessed Sacrament, "I will always defend you". Her sisters and the city were spared.

This event, her writings, and her long hours of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament reveal a woman in love with Jesus Christ and to whom Christ was a real person physically present.


