

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Easter blessings be yours on the Third Sunday of Easter! Today's readings show us that there is tension between what we see and what we believe that happens along our journey of faith. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we have a continuation of events that took place on Pentecost. Peter speaks of the many divine gifts granted to his fellow Israelites through Jesus. And even though many rejected Jesus and had him put to death after seeing the miraculous things he had done, God's saving plan was fulfilled through his triumph over death. Peter and the others could testify to this fact. "God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses. Exalted at the right hand of God, he received the promise of the Holy Spirit from the Father and poured him forth, as you see and hear." Then in the second reading from 1 Peter, we are told that the blood of Jesus is more precious than any earthly gold. He was exalted before the world was created. "He was known before the foundation of the world but revealed in the final time for you, who through him believe in God who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God." And finally, we have the famous resurrection account of Jesus and two disciples on the road to Emmaus. Jesus appears to two disciples in the form of a stranger. He reveals himself by unfolding the Scriptures to them and in the breaking of the bread. So, this story has Jesus appear as a stranger, in the scriptures and in the breaking of the bread. These are the ways he still appears today. "Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of the bread."

There are definite tensions shown in these readings. Now with Pentecost having occurred, Peter feels the need to defend their new and unusual behavior, liking speaking in tongues and bringing forth healings. The two disciples on the road who encounter Jesus likewise have difficulty with all that has happened in recent days: the arrest, trial, crucifixion, and death of Jesus and then, to them at first, a missing body. So, you see that there is tension between what one sees and what one is challenged to believe. Peter summarizes the Christian beliefs about Jesus. He is from God, was crucified and by God's power was raised from death. The two disciples in the gospel are sad and downcast after all that has happened to Jesus.



.They had trusted and left all to follow Jesus and now they had to pick up the pieces of their lives. At first, they fail to recognize Jesus and his real presence. That is not very different from what we do. Then in the meal they share, Jesus becomes real to their sight, but they are called for belief beyond seeing. You and I are invited to join the two disciples from Emmaus as we discover the tension of believing that Jesus still walks with us. The challenge is to believe with the eyes of our souls.

I hope everyone enjoyed Easter Sunday and the octave week with family and friends. There was a joyful spirit of faith, love and friendship permeating throughout our parish from the start of Holy Week, through the Triduum, Easter Masses and to Divine Mercy Sunday. Now, it may be normal to settle things down spiritually and let the power of the Easter message diminish with time. But rather, now just the time to build on the spiritual progress you may have made during Lent and through Easter Sunday. The scriptures are all about the early Church reacting and responding to the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus. Lives were changed and ours should be also, each and every Easter. Enter into these scripture readings that also lead us to the Easter feasts of the Ascension and Pentecost. They are also very important to our faith and how we respond to Jesus as our Lord and Savior. A good resource to help enhance your Eastertide spiritual growth is *FORMED*. Sign up for free by following the prompts on our parish website. Then follow the weekly suggestions to help enhance your Eastertide journey in faith.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note in news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), an ad for those seeking Adult Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday, May 27th, the Human Life Committee's Membership Appeal, a request for Parishioner Emails to help foster communication from the rectory, that invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.





READINGS FOR TODAY'S MASS APRIL 23, 2023-THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

GOSPEL Lk 24:13-35

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

- SAUNTS FUR FARTE - by John Sheppard

As a child, St. Catherine Siena had mystical experiences, seeing guardian angels of others. She was a Dominican and one of the most brilliant theological minds of her day. She continued to have visions of Christ, Mary and the Saints. She was given the Stigmata which became visible after her death. 

ST. RAYMOND'S HUMAN LIFE COMMITTEE

Each Wednesday, after the 8:45 am Mass, we join with 2-3 other pro-lifers in front of the Hempstead Planned Parenthood facility to pray and be a physical witness for the voiceless and vulnerable

unborn babies. We also offer help and information to the girls/women who are scheduled to have an abortion, with the hope that, through the Holy Spirit, they will choose life for their babies and, at the same time, spare themselves the pain of having

had an abortion. Last week, one of the pro-lifers spoke, at different times, with two young women about to enter the abortion facility. Both young women listened for quite a while, took the information and told the pro-lifer that they would consider what she had told them. Neither one went into the PP facility and both drove away. We, more than likely, will never know what these young women will choose but we continue to pray for them and entrust them to God's Love and Mercy. We do know from those who once worked at these abortion facilities and have since left, that by simply praying in front of abortion facilities life-saving differences occur. Abby Johnson, a former PP director and an "Employee of the Year" before having had her

conversion, has said that typically 20% and as high as 75% abortion appointments are "no-show" when there is a prayer presence outside of these facilities. We, too, have experienced this. Several years ago, while praying in front of an abortionist's office, a young mother stopped and told us that she was going to have an abortion, really didn't want to and asked God for a sign to let her know that she shouldn't have the abortion. She had

seen us praying, didn't stop, didn't take any literature, but simply kept on driving -- away from the abortionist's office. She told us that our prayer presence was the sign she needed. After telling us this, she pointed to the baby sitting in the car seat in the back of her car and said with pride, "This is my baby. Two years old." Then, she simply drove off. God is Good!
