Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time! The focus of today's readings it to repent and believe in the Gospel. They call us to listen to God's voice in every moment of our day and to act, with the help of his grace. In the first reading from the prophet Jonah, the people of Nineveh listen to God's voice and respond to Jonah by answering the call to conversion. "When God saw by their actions how they turned from their way, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do to them, he did not carry it out." Then in 1 Corinthians, Paul reminds the people of the urgency to act now, to make the choice to participate in the transformative work God was doing in the world. "For the world in its present form is passing away." And finally in Mark's gospel, we have Jesus calling Simon (Peter), Andrews, James and John to be his followers. His message echoes that of John the Baptist: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel."

When choosing to follow someone or something, hopefully it is done with confidence that whatever or whomever we are following is the best choice we can make. I think this is especially true in the particular area of our lives that has to do with spirituality. It's about what goes in to our following or not following whatever God is calling us to do and to be? And don't think figuring out what God is asking of each of us is easy or always clear. It's not. Sometimes God's call seems to more like a slight tipping of the scales rather than an absolute knowledge as to his wishes and desires and hopes and demands. So, we find ourselves wondering if this is what God is trying to get me to do. We may have a certain feeling that a relationship is not a very good one or that I should be more generous to others. What God asks is that we don't ignore the voice within, don't disregard the nudge you feel. We do a lot to protect our time, relationships, friendships, egos, and comfort zones in unhealthy ways. But God might be challenging us to let go of some of these very things inviting us to give more of ourselves in other ways.

Try not to disregard God's voice or run from it or find excuses not to listen. And don't waste time chasing things not worth chasing. Put your trust in things and people worth trusting.

God keeps inviting us to be so much more, to take his hand and follow, not reluctantly, not half-heartedly, but faithfully, courageously, willingly, and joyfully. Know the difference between the things that will pass away and the things that last, the things of this world and those that will live in eternity. Do your very best in this world, following Jesus' voice, and keep your focus on the world to come, a destination that is more than we could ever imagine.

As I mentioned in last week's bulletin there will be a special second collection taken at all the Masses this weekend for the benefit of relief aid to Father Jim and the hundreds of displaced parishioners from his parish. There is a great need to provide shelter, food, and other basic necessities for several hundred people who lost everything from the rebel attack last month. If you donate by check, please make it out to St. Raymond Parish. Your generosity will be a great help to our good friend Father Jim and his people. Thanks again for your generosity.

The Gospel

For many of us, the Gospel is one of our favorite parts of the Mass. We get to hear the stories about Jesus and the Apostles, how Jesus worked miracles of healing, and the words that he taught. For many, it is easy to imagine the scenes in our minds as we listen to the words. As the General Instruction of the Roman Missal states, "The reading of the Gospel constitutes the high point of the Liturgy of the Word" (GIRM, no. 60). The Second Vatican Council teaches us that the Gospels have a special importance among all the books of the Bible because they are "the principal witness for the life and teaching" of Jesus (Dei Verbum, 18). According to Charles Belmonte, the proclamation of the Gospel "emphasizes the union between the Incarnate Word, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, symbolized by the altar and sacramentally present after the Consecration, and the word of God written in the Gospel."

The Meaning of the Gospel

What does the word Gospel mean? The glossary of the Catechism defines Gospel as "[t]he 'good news' of God's mercy and love revealed in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. [...] The Gospel is handed on in the apostolic tradition of the Church as the source of all-saving truth and moral discipline" (CCC, Glossary, "Gospel"). The four Gospels are named after their human writers: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The Second Vatican Council teaches, "The Church has always and everywhere maintained, and continues to maintain, the apostolic origin of the four Gospels. The apostles preached, as Christ had charged them to do, and then, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they and others of the apostolic age handed on to us in writing the same message they had preached, the foundation of our faith: the fourfold Gospel, according to Matthew, Mark, Luke and John." (Dei Verbum, 18).

During the Mass, after we stand for the Gospel Acclamation, the priest or deacon begins with that familiar dialogue: "The Lord be with you!" and the people respond, "And with your spirit!" Then, the priest introduces the Gospel and the people respond, "Glory to you, O Lord!" These back-and-forth dialogues help us to

prepare for what is about to happen; the Lord Jesus speaking to us. Another preparation for the words of Jesus is a simple gesture of a sign of the Cross. As the priest or deacon says, "A reading from the holy Gospel according to...," he will make a sign of the Cross on the Gospel book. At the same time, the people at Mass trace a small sign of the Cross on their foreheads, lips, and chests. I still remember, as a young boy, my dad teaching us to make this gesture and to say to ourselves: "May the words of the Gospel be in my mind, on my lips, and in my heart." Those words have stayed with me through the years and are still a sincere prayer that the Word of God would be at the forefront of my daily living. As the Diocese of Peoria teaches, these acts and prayers are all "signs of veneration for the Word of God proclaimed to us in the holy Gospel. Our standing, our singing the Alleluia, our gestures and our responses are all outward signs of our inward disposition of love for Christ and reverence for his Word"

Our Response to the Gospel

At the conclusion of the gospel passage for a particular Mass, the priest or deacon says, "The Gospel of the Lord!" Our response in faith is, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!" Then, the priest or deacon kisses the page he just read from and says silently, "Through the words of the Gospel may our sins be wiped away." Charles Belmonte beautifully writes that "we can at least make ours the kiss the priest has placed on the sacred book. With it, we want to tell our Lord we are ready to give our lives for the truths contained in the Gospel... At the same time, we ask forgiveness for our faults. Of course, the Gospels are so wonderful that we should read and pray about them more often than just at Sunday Mass. The life of Jesus is so rich and beautiful and can really provide great strength for us every day. Maybe try reading just one chapter of the Gospels every day and see what happens!

For Reflection:

- Begin reading one chaper of the four Gospels each day. Savor this opportunity to journey closer into relationship with Jesus.
- 2. What do the opening verses of each Gospel reveal about the message in the passage?

Five Minutes for Peace Eucharistic Revival Blog - Colleen R. Schena

Even though the sun sets within ten minutes of leaving work in the winter, the sunset fills my nearby church with the most ethereal glow. The warmth of the church envelops me as I genuflect and kneel in the pew, my mind racing over my day in the silence. Most days, I pray with whatever thoughts come flying through my head. Eventually, the absence of noise settles into a peaceful, holy, and quiet presence. My struggle to focus on our Eucharistic Lord shifts into the desire to stay put in the silent, golden space for a little longer.

An Invitation to Peace

In those five minutes, I am reminded that seeking out God and that which he offers us is the most important thing we do every day. Time spent praying with the Eucharist changes us, our lives, and our world for the better-even if all it seems to do is calm our hearts. Our world yearns for peace. Wars and injustice fill our news with suffering which steals our peace, physically and spiritually. Yet in the chaos, Our Lord invites us into an abiding peace. What better way to help the world, he says, than by resting in him who made it? While I still struggle to embrace silence, it's comforting to know that even the greatest saints knew this struggle. Saint John Paul II articulated it perfectly: "In order to do, we must first learn 'to be'... in the sweet company of Jesus in Adoration."

Jesus' Invitation to Us

The Lord means it when he says to us in the Gospel of Matthew, "Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I shall give you rest" (Mt 11:28).

If we give God the chance to ease our burdens, he provides what we need. And that includes peace in our ever-chaotic world and our aching hearts. Jesus calms the seas with a word in the Gospels; he frees us from our shackles and our worries. He reminds us that we have no need for worry: "do not be afraid, for you are worth more than many sparrows" (Mt 10:31)...

Eucharistic Witness Blessed Carlos Manuel Cecilio Layperson (†1963)

Feast: July 13



Carlos Manuel Cecilio Rodríguez Santiago, "Charlie," was born in 1918 in Puerto Rico. In 1925, his family home was destroyed fire and the family moved in with grandmother, who helped him grow in his Catholic faith. She encouraged them to attend daily Mass before going to school or work. As he grew older, his poor poor health derailed his desire to become a priest. Yet he was undeterred.


Working as office clerk, he dedicated his salary to promote a greater understanding of the Catholic liturgy. Charlie organized discussion groups across the entire island to help people to understand and participate in the Mass. He also taught catechism to high school students and joined the Knights of Columbus. Charlie worked tirelessly to restore the loss of liturgical customs that had been abandoned over generations. He advocated for active participation of the laity in prayer.


Charlie especially loved the Easter Vigil, saying, "We live for the night of the Resurrection!" He expressed particular concern over the Easter vigil, saying that it had lost its ancient character as the focal night of the Christian year. To his delight, the Easter vigil was restored to its proper time near midnight by Pope Pius XII in 1952.

As his illness worsen, he continued to share his faith with great strength, putting his faith in Christ and moving forward with trust. Dying on July 13, 1963, Charlie was beatified by Pope St. John Paul II on April 29, 2001. He is the first Puerto Rican and and the first Caribbean-born layperson to be beatified. In the Western Hemisphere, Rodríguez is only the second layperson to be beatified, the first being St. Kateri Tekakwitha



Also, the gifts of baby clothing, hand-made blankets, hats, sweaters, etc. and the many gift cards from our parish's "Christmas Giving Tree" were delivered to the Hempstead pregnancy care center where the need is great and the gifts deeply appreciated! For those who may not know, the Life Center pregnancy care centers do not receive government funding. They depend on donations from individuals, organization parishes, According to Gloria Schreiber, CEO of the Life Center, "On average, we distribute the equivalent of over \$800,000. in material aid each year. Our 'Adopt a Mom and Child Program' enables us to provide the much needed material support to the families we serve. Communal Prayer Before Mass


