## Father Chuck's Corner

**Greetings and God's blessing be yours on the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time!** This weekend will be our third one back at Mass in our church. The attendance rose slightly from the first weekend to the second. I know that some people are still hesitant to come to Mass and that is very understandable. Remember the obligation does not apply at this time and those who are sick in any way or vulnerable due to age or health conditions should still refrain from coming. Keep praying along with Mass on tv or online and always make a Spiritual Communion. So far, we have been able to accommodate all who have come to Mass. Remember that masks are to be worn throughout the Mass. Not everyone feels comfortable receiving Holy Communion yet, which is also understandable. At each Mass we are careful to sanitize before distributing Holy Communion. At each station there is also a sanitizer available if needed and at each Mass we instruct everyone on the procedure to follow when receiving. We ask all to receive on in the hand with your mask on, step away, remove mask and consume the Body of Christ. Then instead of returning to your seat, everyone is asked to leave the church so we can clean between the Masses. I want to thank the ushers and volunteers who are taking the time after each Mass to disinfect the pews, bathrooms, the sanctuary, and other places of contact. Also thank you for using the baskets set up on the pew shelves for your contributions. **Your commitment in giving and your generosity is most appreciated, especially at this time.**

Today's theme, rather harshly, tells us that we should not let anything surpass our faith in God. In the first reading from 2 Kings, Elisha offers in thanksgiving something only God could give. The reward comes to someone who listens to the word of God. **"When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, this time next year you will be fondling a baby son."** Then in the second reading from Romans, we die and rise with Jesus through Baptism. **"We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life."** And finally, Matthew's gospel lays out the requirements for being a disciple, which are stringent and bold. It is obvious that such a life is not for the weak or timid. Being a disciple forces one to reconfigure almost every aspect of one's personal, social, and religious life. In today's gospel family relationships and taking up one's cross are highlighted. **"Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."**



When Jesus speaks of **"love more than"** he is not exactly trying to pit family against each other or dismiss love of family as insignificant. You are not expected to spend more time talking to Jesus than to your children or that prayer will give you a warmer glow than cuddling an infant child. What Jesus is referring to are actual conflicts between his teachings and the expectations of someone else. Jesus surpasses pleasing or obeying a family member if doing so would flatly contradict loyalty to him. Examples of things that are likely to clamor for first place in our **"love"** attention would include prestige, power, money, worldly success, and material possessions. The early Christian communities knew that nothing was more important than loyalty to Jesus. And the same should hold true for us even now. When we receive Jesus in the Eucharist, we should ask for the grace never to put him in second place.

**Our winning ticket for the Go for the Green 50/50 was pulled last Sunday and the winning ticket was #A00384. The winner received \$2900.** Thanks to everyone who supported this fund raiser which benefits St. Raymond School. Next on the agenda is the new round of **Parish Picks** which will start in August. Regular envelope users received an application in the mail and there is also an order form in the bulletin. **It would be great if we could have a big turnout for this fundraiser.** We definitely need all the help we can get to increase our parish revenue at this time.

Remember that we are on our regular schedule of Masses each day of the week. Our rectory is now open Monday thru Friday from 9am till 4pm and Saturday and Sunday from 10am till 5pm. Parish Social Ministry is also open Monday thru Thursday from 10am till 2pm. Please call for an appointment (887-9197). Have a great week and enjoy your July 4<sup>th</sup> Independence Day holiday. In a moment of silence, try to listen to the voice of God.
- 5. ASK FOR FORGIVENESS**  
Express your sorrow for the world's sins and your own.
