Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's focus is on how trustworthy a child of God can be and how one can grow in trustworthiness. The small and great matters with which we are entrusted may differ, but each one offers us an important opportunity to live out our faith. In the first reading from the prophet Amos, we see how God has harshly judged the evil ways of the people. They are only focused on themselves at the expense of others. "The Lord has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Never will I forget a thing they have done." Then in the second reading from 1 Timothy, Paul asks that all prayers and petitions be expressions of gratitude to God. He makes this request because it is God's will that everyone be saved through Jesus. "For there is one God. There is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as ransom for all." And finally, in Luke's gospel we have one of those parables of Jesus that tends to baffle the listeners because of actions that are questionable in terms of justice and honor. An absentee landlord had discovered that his business manager was a crook and so he intended to fire him. The manager tried to curry favor with those who owed money to the landlord by reducing their debts. So, the landlord, instead of being angry, actually praised the manager for creatively providing for his own future. Jesus is really trying to get his disciples to be at least as resourceful when proclaiming the Gospel of the kingdom. Will they make good use of material possessions to advance faith in God? The ultimate message is "No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and man."

So, what does it mean to be "trustworthy?" Words such as reliable, dependable, honest, full of integrity, truthful, ethical, responsible, and true all come to mind. You can also say that trustworthy people are steady, compassionate, kind, humble, available, and authentic. Examples would be doing your tasks when asked to do so, behaving appropriately when with others, telling the truth, being ethical in business dealings, being dependable and faithful as a reliable spouse. We are also invited in the second reading to be trustworthy in prayer. Haven't the faithful prayer of others impacted your life? They sure have for me! The gospel today says that those who are trustworthy in small matters will also be trustworthy in great matters. There sure are a lot of "great matters" from bullying to racism, to world peace and the environment, to name just a few.

Think of some of the words used to describe being trustworthy and figure out some practical examples of ways to live them out. Remember there are always examples of being truthful, keeping commitments, offering a helping hand that can be ways to show trustworthiness in your daily life. See the connection that in doing such things you are really being trustworthy followers of Jesus and living with the devotion and dignity that St. Paul speaks of in today's second reading. May our sharing in the lifegiving feast of the Eucharist strengthen us to be trustworthy disciples in small and great ways.

Today is Catechetical Sunday throughout our diocese when we recognize and give thanks to all who share their faith witness as teachers of our *Catholic Faith.* We are so blest to have over 50 catechists and volunteers in our parish program with Lucy Ostermann as our Director of Religious Education. Our program has always been a strong and a solid tribute to the many people who have shared their faith witness with the children of our parish. And today we also recognize and pay tribute to **Evelyn Contaldi** who for over 35 years was the director of our program. Much of our current success is due to her leadership and vision over all these years. Today we will honor Evelyn at the 10:30am Mass along with all our catechists. After Mass there will be a special reception for Evelyn and her family in the school cafeteria. Everyone is invited.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, an invitation to our next Holy Hour on Wednesday evening, September 28th at 7pm in the church, a request for Parishioner Emails to help foster better communication from the rectory, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER PROGRAM THREE MONTH GROWING BABY IN UTERO

Your spiritually adopted baby is now approximately three inches in length. He or she has developed the body parts required to experience pain, including all the nerves, spinal cord and thalamus. The baby can now squint, swallow and move his or her tongue. He or she sleeps and awakens. Fingernails and toenails form and the baby now has his or her own fingerprints. Sensitive to touch, the baby will tightly grasp an object placed in the palm of his or her hand. In fact, earlier this month, at nine weeks, the baby began sucking his or her thumb! From this age on, there is only growth in size and maturation of the organs already present. All organ systems are functioning. The child is now called a "fetus", which means "little one". Embryo, fetus, toddler, adolescent, adult - all are merely names of human life at different stages. You didn't come from a "fetus". No, at one time in your life you were a "fetus", or toddler, adolescent, adult, etc. As this precious child is being formed by our loving God, let us continue to pray for the little one we have spiritually adopted that his or her parents will bring their baby to a live birth. The power of prayer is great! Thank you for participating in this prayer program for life. (Suggestion: When you are at home, take a ruler and measure three inches to visually see the actual size of the baby at this stage of his or her life. Tiny but perfectly human).






Ocean Financial Federal Credit Union Supports St. Raymond!

'We Give Thanks to God'

We give thanks to God for today's decision of the United States Supreme Court in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization. This just decision will save countless innocent children simply waiting to be born.

On this historic day, our gratitude extends to the millions of heroic Americans who have worked tirelessly toward this outcome for nearly a half-century. Women and men, children and adults, believers and non-believers, people of every culture and background have advocated for life. They have been a charitable and compelling voice for the voiceless, and today, their voice has been heard.

As Catholics, we have prayed and fasted, held vigils, offered Masses, and peacefully witnessed in these last five decades. We have joined others in educating schoolchildren, opening pregnancy care centers, walking with mothers, offering post-abortion counseling, and marching, year after year, to the United States Supreme Court to witness for life. Today, our voice has been heard.

With the entire pro-life community, we are overjoyed with this outcome of the Court. However, we acknowledge the wide range of emotions associated with this decision. We call on all Catholics and everyone who supports the right to life for unborn children to be charitable, even as we celebrate an important historical moment and an answer to a prayer.

We must remember that this is a judicial victory, not a cultural one. The culture remains deeply divided on the issue, which will be evidenced by the patchwork of state statutes pertaining to abortion across the country. To change the culture and build a culture of life, we need to enact family-friendly policies that welcome children, support mothers, cherish families and empower them to thrive. Building a culture of life is not solely the responsibility of the government or those heroic individuals working on the front lines, in crisis pregnancy centers and other ministries. All of us need to respect the dignity and sanctity of human life in everything we do: in how we treat our children, spouses and parents; in the way we behave in our place of work; in sum, how we live Jesus' two great commandments to love God and love our neighbor.

Love, charity and reverence for human life from the moment of conception through natural death - these will build and sustain a culture of life.

Millions of Americans have worked tirelessly for almost 50 years towards this outcome. We thank them with every fiber of our being. Their vital work continues, and we commit ourselves to it.
