Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Easter blessings be yours on the Fourth Sunday of Easter. Well the month of May is upon us. It is now the seventh weekend without public Masses. I know there is a lot of sadness, disappointment and yearning for us to be able to celebrate our regular Masses in St. Raymond Church. Believe me, Fathers Theo, Joseph and Vincent share your feelings. While we are faithful in celebrating private Masses each day to fulfill our regular schedule, of course it is just not the same. God willing, hopefully, there will be some chance in the near future to be able to pray with all of you. Until then, keep praying in solidarity with each other as we do with you here at St. Raymond's. And May, dedicated to Our Lady, is a great time to pray a daily Rosary too!

The focus of this Sunday's readings is to affirm the centrality of the passion, death and resurrection Of Jesus in our life of faith. The first reading from Acts show how when people hear and accept the preaching of the apostles, they are moved to repent and be baptized. **"Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."** Then in the second reading from 1Peter, the people are reminded that suffering for the good of others is a special grace from God and that through the wounds of Jesus the world has been healed. **"He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness."** And finally, John's gospel gives us the picture of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. He comes to the sheep and they recognize him. They hear his voice and they follow him as the gate to life. **"I am the gate for the sheep. I came so they might have life and have it more abundantly."**

We need to connect the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus with events in our own lives, as well as with the image of the sheepfold to come, in order to understand why our Easter celebration is meant to last a lifetime. The Church centers one fourth of the entire year as Roman Catholic Christians around Easter. First there was Lent for 40 days and then Easter for 50 days. Now if you are a person who likes change, or efficiency, or you get bored easily you might think this is too much time. Just think of how you are feeling after over a month of dealing with staying home, working from home, wearing a mask, no school, no job, no food, not seeing anybody, dealing with illness, anxiety, depression and everything else that this pandemic is causing.


Easter challenges us to hear the voice of Jesus and follow him, like the sheep, into the warmth, safety and security of the sheepfold. We cannot climb over the wall or sneak in. We have to follow Jesus through the gate. Jesus lead the way by his passion, death and resurrection into the safety and rest of the sheepfold. And we have to follow because there is no other way except through the fullness of Easter. Easter is the great revelation of what God has done for us, and what awaits us through faith. We need to keep remembering all that Jesus has done for us, and is still doing by his passion, death and resurrection. Easter is never truly over, and we are called to continue to become an Easter people.

Next Sunday, May 10th is Mother's Day. It is a day when we honor and thank all our Mothers, both living and deceased who have meant so much to us throughout our lives. Unfortunately, we are not able to be with all our Mothers and Grandmothers these days which is sad, and celebrations will be minimal. So, to add a bright spot to the day I would like to offer a special **Drive-by Blessing with the Blessed Sacrament** next Sunday from 10am till Noon. Fathers Theo, Vincent, Joseph and I would love to see you and so would Jesus. Simply drive in from Carman Avenue behind the rectory and we will be there to greet you. Then you would exit on Roosevelt Avenue. So, pack your car, van or truck and come by St. Raymond's next Sunday morning.

Let us keep praying for all those afflicted with the virus. And always remember those who have died and their families who grieve. We continue to pray for those from our parish who have died and received a blessing on their way to burial, Remember too all who are sacrificing themselves to care for all the sick and those who work in so many ways to keep our lives safe and moving forward. There are so many unsung heroes who truly image the face of Jesus to us these days. God protect them.

Have a good week. **Continue to pray and find ways to be an Easter people who live by the belief that Jesus Christ is risen. Indeed, he is risen!** God bless always.

Remember when abortion was made legal in 1973 (1970 in N.Y.) how language was used to convince people that abortion should be "legal, safe and rare", or a politician trying to have it both ways "personally opposed to abortion but couldn't impose my view on others", and the PR slogan "pro-choice making "choice" very American sounding, a "woman's choice" or worse a "woman's right". But worst of all was, and still is, the denial and the hiding, through euphemisms, the existence of the baby in the womb with the words, "product of conception", "blob of tissue", or "parasite", even using the correct biological term "fetus" in order not to have people visualize a live, innocent, beautiful BABY residing in his or her mother's womb.
